

Two Tunics was established to provide support directly into communities affected by the HIV crisis in the Ugu District of Kwazulu Natal in South Africa.

Through enabling, networking and strengthening community based partners, Two Tunics is able to expand care and treatment to those affected by HIV/AIDS.

A key focus of Two Tunics is the care of orphans and vulnerable children (OVC) in the community through local Community Based Projects (CBP). Through husband and wife team Dr Mike and Robin Nash, Two Tunics has been able to forge strong community partnerships, deliver effective AIDS treatment through Anti-Retro Virul drug therapy and partner with government and private health care systems to ensure long-term sustainable care and treatment services.



### COMMUNITY CRECHE PROJECT- COMMUNITIES FOR KIDS

Setup to provide daily care, love and support to orphans and vulnerable children, Two Tunics' goal is to support and build the capacity of the community to take care of their own children in a way that maximises the child's health and safety. Two Tunics employs a project coordinator to oversee and support several community creche's and feeding schemes.

Community Crèches require donations of healthy foods to maintain good nutrition for children who may otherwise miss out at home. Along with the need to erect basic infrastructure, health care supplies like gloves, nappies, creams and medicines as well as crèche toys and books are also needed.
